The Hope Lutheran Church Women met on October 21, 2010, at 2:00 p.m. with Betty Prellwitz in charge of the program entitled, "People of God, The Body of Christ". Betty talked about how Paul in 1st Corinthians compares us to the human body and however different the parts are they all function together for the good of the whole body, just as the members of the church are all different--they all function for the good of the church. Therefore, there is unity in diversity. Betty emphasized we are all unique in our own way with God giving us all different gifts with the purpose of working together as Christians to spread the Good News of salvation. Betty brought balloons in which each balloon had a question about how we would use our talents or gifts God has given us. Each chose a balloon to see how their special talent could be used to

- The Board of Education recommended the Sunday School offerings go toward a mission project.

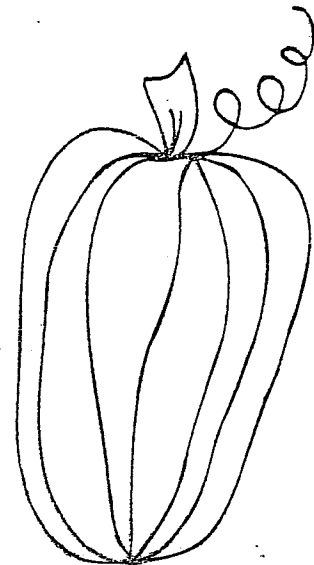

Weekday entries are offered as guides to prayer for the global, social and outreach ministries of the church. Thank you for your continued prayers for the life and mission of this church.

1 All Saints Day

Give thanks for the retirement support groups in congregations like St. Paul Lutheran Church, Omaha, Nev., asking God to bless recent retirees with satisfaction for vocations well served and with new callings appropriate to the years to come.

2 Praise the Lord the Rev. Kathryn Warn who serves in Freetown, Sierra Leone as pastor in residence with the Evangelical Lutheran Church in Sierra Leone, helping foster the relationship with their companion, the Northern Texas Louisiana synod.

3 Ask for the inspiration of the Holy Spirit for Rosario Hernandez-Cruz as she leads La Sagrada Familia, a new Synodically Authorized Worshipping Community in Langley Park, Md.

9 Thank God for the dedication and creative spirits of Martin and Suzanne Shoffner, serving with the ELCA in Palestine. Martin is the coordinator for the Young Adults in Global Mission in Palestine and for group trips to the Holy Land.

20 Universal Children's Day

Thank God for the 58 children of the Anyuak Faith Community who were baptized at Our Savior's Lutheran Church, Austin, Minn., on Sept. 5. Other children and adults, originally from Sudan and Ethiopia, anticipate being baptized soon. William Okweari is the community's lay leader.

21 Christ the King

O God, in the midst of health, economic, political and social challenges in the African nations of Burkina Faso, Chad, Mali, Mauritania and Niger, we pray that your abounding grace may bring strength and hope to the people.

22 Praise God for the commitment and ministry of ELCA volunteer missionaries, especially the many English-speaking teachers serving at the Lutheran schools in Bratislava, Liptovsky Mikulas, and Tisovec, Slovakia, and Cieszyn, Poland.

23 We pray for the ministry of Grace Lutheran Church, Richmond, Calif., as it invites and serves its neighborhood. Grace is utilizing the gifts of a symphony orchestra to reach out to its community

24 Invite the Holy Spirit to guide and direct Pastor John Cummings and the Latino Ministry Start in southwest Detroit as they discern who will participate on the “lead team” for this new ministry.

29 Andrew, Apostle

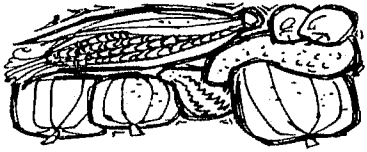
